Information on identifying a potential brownfield site

The Brownfields Redevelopment Incentive Program (BRIP) defines a brownfield as *“any real property in this State that is currently vacant or underutilized and on which there has been, or there is suspected to have been, a discharge of a contaminant or on which there is contaminated building material.”*

- [Brownfields Inventory](#): Access a mapping layer on potential target sites, acreage, cleanup status, and property owner contact information, as part of NJDEP’s Community Collaborative Initiative. This includes locations in: Bayonne, Bridgeton, Camden, Jersey City, Millville, Newark, Paterson, Paulsboro, Perth Amboy, Salem, Trenton, and Vineland.
- [Sustainable New Jersey](#): Find information on brownfield sites for various municipalities. Select “brownfields” as the action and filter the data to only show brownfield sites.
- [Known Contaminated Sites List](#): Managed by NJDEP this list provides the status of remediation process, although it does not indicate redevelopment potential.
- Local Contacts: Reach out to municipal or county economic development directors or planners for information on available properties.
